- 12 A That was in the middle of the fall.
- 13 Q Was that the fall of 2010?
- 14 A 2010, yes.
- 15 Q Okay. And when you went there with her that
- 16 night, nothing romantic happened between the two of you
- 17 that night; is that correct?
- 18 A That's correct.
- 19 Q And when you went to Ryles with Kamilah Willingham
- 20 and that was also approximately the
- 21 fall of 2010; is that correct?
- 22 A Yes.
- 23 Q And nothing romantic happened between you and
- 24 | Kamilah Willingham on that night; is that correct?
- 25 A Yes.

- 1 Q And nothing romantic happened between you and

- 4 Q And when Kamilah Willingham was texting you, as
- 5 you were shown in one of those exhibits, in November
- and December of 2010, that didn't bother you, did it?

- 12 at the time, do you remember approximately when that

- 15 Q So about six or seven days or so before the night
- 16 in question, the night of January 14th; is that right?
- 17 A Yes. Possibly a little farther on, yeah.
- 18 Q Possible a little what? I'm sorry.
- 19 A Possibly a few days later.
- 20 Q So you think it was around January 8th?
- 21 A Yes.
- 22 Q And drawing your attention to when you were in
- 23 | Kamilah Willingham's apartment on the night of January
- 24 14th, you indicated that you and Kamilah and
- at some point all did cocaine; is that right?

- 1 A That's right.
- 2 Q To your recollection, was anyone using an I.D.
- 3 card to move around the cocaine or make lines of
- 4 cocaine?
- 5 A Not to my recollection.
- 6 Q And you haven't been charged with anything, any
- 7 crime, relating to your use of cocaine that night; is
- 8 that correct?
- 9 A That's correct.
- 10 Q When you made that video for Kamilah's mom with
- and Kamilah, you indicated that was in the
- 12 living room; is that right?
- 13 A I don't remember where was when we were
- 14 making that video.

- 18 of temporary sobriety at that point?
- 19 A I'm not sure.
- 20 Q Well, how would you describe it?
- 21 A She was awake. She was talking to me.
- 22 Q What was she talking about?
- 23 A I don't remember.
- 24 Q Were you saying anything to her?
- 25 A Well, at least, I told her to lift her arms up.

- 1 And I remember saying her name.
- 2 Q Did she say anything back to you when you told her
- 3 to lift her arms up?
- 4 A I don't remember. She lifted her arms up, though.
- 5 Q So you said at one point in your statement to
- 6 Sally that she was groggy and that she made, she
- 7 barely responded, just like, Agh, sort of groggy
- 8 answer. Do you remember that?
- 9 A Yes.
- 10 Q And that's when you took her shirt off; is that
- 11 right?
- 12 A No. She sat up before that.
- 13 Q Did you start making out with her before you took
- 14 her shirt off?
- 15 A Yes.
- 16 Q And then while you were doing that, you took her
- 17 shirt off?
- 18 A Yes.
- 19 Q And how far did you get her bra off?
- 20 A I may have unhooked one of the two hooks in the
- 21 back.
- 22 Q So when you fell asleep, was still awake; is
- 23 that right?
- 24 A Yes.
- 25 | Q And the bra was still on her body?

- 1 A Yes.
- 2 Q But one hook out of two was undone?
- 3 A Perhaps. I'm not sure. I remember fiddling with
- 4 it.
- 5 Q Did it end up anywhere else on her body or was it
- 6 still generally in the same place?
- 7 A It was probably still rearranged a little bit, but
- 8 it was still on the body.
- 9 Q So still on the front of her body and on the back
- 10 of her body?
- 11 A Yes.
- 12 Q Still around her?
- 13 A Still around her, yeah.
- 14 Q Okay. And in June of 2011 you told Sally
- 15 that this was a totally cool experience. Do you recall
- 16 telling her that?
- 17 A Yes.
- 18 Q What made it a totally cool experience?
- 19 A I was having fun.
- 20 Q Why were you having fun?
- 21 A We were dancing. We were talking, smiling,
- 22 laughing, making out. It was fun.
- 23 Q What made it totally cool back at the apartment?
- 24 A I'm not sure I understand that question.
- 25 Q Well, would you say that the whole night was a

- 1 totally cool experience?
- 2 A My impression at the time was yes.
- 3 Q So what, back at the apartment, made it a totally
- 4 cool experience?
- 5 A Well, back at the apartment not much really
- 6 happened. The totally cool part was probably mostly on
- 7 the dance floor.
- 8 Q When you were talking to Sally though, in
- 9 June of 2011, when you described it as being a totally
- 10 cool experience, you were talking about how you were
- 11 confused by Kamilah Willingham's questioning of what
- 12 you had done to is that right?
- 13 A Yes.
- 14 Q So what Kamilah Willingham was questioning you
- 15 about wasn't what you had done at the Middlesex, it was
- 16 what you had done back at the apartment; is that right?
- 17 A That is right, yes.
- 18 Q So what about being back at the apartment made it
- 19 a totally cool experience, in your words, in June of
- 20 2011?
- 21 A Because it was a continuation of what had went on
- 22 at the Middlesex Lounge.
- 23 Q Did you think that was flirting with you when
- 24 you were at Kamilah's apartment before you went to the
- 25 Middlesex Lounge?

- 1 A No.
- 2 Q Was she flirting with you at the Middlesex Lounge
- 3 before she came up to you and put her arms around your
- 4 | neck and kissed you?
- 5 A No.
- 6 Q You told Sally that when you first got to
- 7 the Middlesex you wanted to get away from them, meaning
- 8 and Kamilah, for a little bit. Do you remember
- 9 saying that?
- 10 A Yes.
- 11 Q Why did you want to get away from them for a
- 12 little bit?
- 13 A Because I wanted to talk to some new people.
- 14 Q And you said at the end of the night when was
- 15 getting her coat, that she was talking to some other
- 16 guys; is that right?
- 17 A Yes.
- 18 Q How did that make you feel?
- 19 A It made me feel like I wasn't sure whether or not
- 20 | she would come back to me.
- 21 Q Did it make you feel jealous?
- 22 A Not really. No.
- 23 Q When you woke up in the middle of the night, you
- 24 say that Kamilah was kissing you; is that right?
- 25 A Yes.

- 1 Q Do you remember what was wearing at that time
- 2 in the middle of the night?
- 3 A No.
- 4 Q So you didn't see
- 5 A Well, I knew she was there?
- 6 A How did you know she was there then?
- 7 A I must have seen a dim impression of her. It was
- 8 a bed with three people in, and it was very close
- 9 quarters, so. Somehow I knew she was there.
- 10 Q So in that dim impression, could you see if she
- 11 was wearing anything on the top of her body?
- 12 A No.
- 13 Q You couldn't see that?
- 14 A No.
- 15 Q Could you see if she was asleep?
- 16 A No. But I knew she was asleep.
- 17 | Q How did you know she was asleep then?
- 18 A She didn't say anything.
- 19 Q Did you say anything to her?
- 20 A I perhaps said her name.
- 21 Q And you didn't touch her at that point; --
- 22 A No.
- 23 Q -- is that your testimony?
- 24 A Yes.
- 25 Q Did Kamilah ever have to pull your hair at any

- 1 point in the middle of the night?
- 2 A No.
- 3 Q When you were back at the apartment with and
- 4 you were in the bed with her, before you passed out,
- 5 you said that she was still awake; is that right?
- 6 A Yes.
- 7 Q And were her jeans still on?
- 8 A I'm not sure.
- 9 Q So when you walked into Kamilah's apartment,
- 10 was already on the bed; is that right?
